Weekly Ayush Internship Training Programme for MBBS Interns at SCRU, Tirupati:

To raise knowledge of Siddha medicine, the Siddha Clinical Research Unit (SCRU), Tirupati, has started hosting weekly educational sessions for MBBS interns from Sri Padmavathi Medical College for Women (SPMCW), SVIMS. In addition to therapeutic techniques like Yogam, Varmam, and Thokkanam (therapeutic massage), a fresh group of students is trained practically in Siddha diagnoses like as Naadi Parisothanai (Pulse diagnosis), Neerkuri-Neikuri (Urine analysis), and Manikadai Nool (Anthropometry) every week. Insights into Siddha's holistic healthcare approach and garden-based learning about medicinal plants are also included in the courses. The program, which benefits about 20 students every month, helps them better comprehend traditional medicine and cultivates a team-based approach to contemporary, holistic therapy.



Siddha Integrative class to the Nursing students, at Siddha Clinical Research Unit, Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi:

2nd Year B. Sc Nursing Students of the College of Nursing, Dr Ram Manohar Lohia College of Medical Sciences attended the Siddha class on 30th November 2024 at Siddha Clinical Research Unit, Safdarjung Hospital, New Delhi in 2 separate batches. Dr (Mrs) Rathi Balachandran, Current Principal and Former Assistant Director General (Nursing) and Sr Faculty College of Nursing, ABVIMS & Dr RML Hospital MoHFW, Government of India took an initiative for Siddha Integrative Class. Dr. M. Mohanapriya took a class for Nursing students about the Pathophysiology, Preventive measures and treatment modalities of Cholelithiasis as per Siddha along with the Basics of the Siddha system of medicine. The introduction and concept of Siddha were explained by the Doctors which will facilitate the inculcation of Siddha in Allopathic practice to improve patient footfall.

Observation of World Diabetes Day – 2024:

On November 14, 2024, Siddha Central Research Institute (SCRI), Chennai, observed World Diabetes Day by inaugurating an Integrated Diabetic OPD and organizing a medical camp at the National Institute of Epidemiology (ICMR), Ayapakkam. Under the direction of Prof. Dr. N.J. Muthukumar, Director General, CCRS, and with support from Dr. A.
